Urgent Call for Action

We have added an <u>urgent Call for Action</u> to our website. This is to write to your MP to ask him or her to promote the establishment of a new cross-party committee to scrutinise the expenditure on UK aid now that DfID has been merged with the Foreign and Commonwealth Office, meaning the end of the International Development Select Committee. There will very soon be a free vote on the establishment of a new cross-party committee to scrutinise expenditure on UK aid. Such a committee is essential to try to ensure the continuation of our current high standard of UK aid expenditure on poverty alleviation.
