Campaigns

The Holy Land

The recent deaths and destruction in the Holy Land are shocking. Building on the expertise of Antony Vallyon and Brian Beeley, we have shaped our current campaign to try to protect the human rights of all who live in the Holy Land and to ensure that all UK organisations can use their economic influence to protest against abuses of human rights. It is also important that accusations of 'antisemitism' should not be conflated with valid criticism of actions of the Israeli government. We therefore are encouraging the use of the <u>Jerusalem Declaration on 'antisemitism'</u> not <u>that of the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance (IHRA)</u>. There is more background on these issues <u>on our website</u>, with suggestions for the actions we need from: the UK government; public bodies and companies; and the Office of the UN High Commissioner for Human Rights. The most effective way of influencing ministers in our UK government is to write to our MPs whose communications are more likely to get into the Ministers' 'red boxes'.

Ukraine

Following discussion at our AGM and by our Policy Committee, we have agreed a resolution on <u>Using International Law in relation to Russia's Invasion of Ukraine</u>. We have sent this to the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO) and will share their response with you.

Climate Change

It is important that we keep up the pressure to tackle climate change. Recognising the major challenges facing us, the Climate Coalition (of which LASER is a member) <u>encourages us</u> to urge the whole Government to come together to tackle the climate, nature and cost of living crises.
