UN Reform

Our Climate and Oceans Officer, Gonzalo Alvarez, calls the remarkable new *UN Oceans Treaty* "a landmark achievement for the World Oceans; a historic triumph for multilateralism". He describes the Treaty more fully on our website. For the treaty to come into effect, we need to persuade our MPs to urge the government to ratify this treaty. Gonzalo writes, "This Ocean Treaty gives us some hope for the future of this damaged planet."

Climate Change



People across the country are coming together between **10th and 18th June** in a week-long celebration of community action to tackle climate change and protect nature. There is still time to plan local events for this <u>Great Big Green Week</u>, coordinated by the Climate Coalition (of which LASER is a member).

Stop Killer Robots

In February, 33 states from Latin America and the Caribbean issued a historic call from the region for "the urgent negotiation of an international legally binding instrument on autonomy in weapons systems." Currently, no specific international law regulates the use or development of autonomous weapons. UNA-UK, together with the Stop Killer Robots campaign, has been calling for this legal gap to be addressed for over ten years. As the deployment of systems with autonomous capabilities has been reported in Ukraine and Libya, this objective has become an urgent priority. There is further information here from which you can urge your MP to persuade the UK to push for a new international law.

On **2 May, 18:30**, UNA Westminster is holding a public meeting in **Room 4A**, **House of Lords** on **Towards Press Freedom: New hope or false dawn?** to mark the 30th anniversary of World Press Freedom Day (3 May) and also the 10th anniversary of the *UN Plan of Action on the Safety of Journalists*. Speakers will include: **Lord David Neuberger of Abbotsbury**, Chair of the High Level Panel of Experts on Media Freedom; former President of the UK Supreme Court (invited); **Amberin Zaman**, UK-based Turkish journalist, *Al-Monitor* international correspondent; Coalition of Women Journalists press freedom 'Hero'; **Marianna Spring**, BBC Disinformation and Social Media correspondent (invited); **William Horsley**, UK Chair, Association of European Journalists.

On the eve of high level meetings at the UN and at UNESCO, our speakers will present bold but practical pathways to reclaim the information sphere for unhindered journalism, open public debate and free and fair elections. The keynote Folke Bernadotte Memorial Conversation will be held between **Dr Karin von Hippel**, RUSI Director-General and Nicholas Haysom, Special Representative of the UN Secretary-General and Head of the UN Mission in South Sudan. There will also be a Panel Discussion on Peacekeeping Training worldwide.


On **25 May, 13:15**, at **the cenotaph in Whitehall**, UNA Westminster is organising the **20**th **Annual Wreath-laying Ceremony to mark the International Day of UN Peacekeepers**. This ceremony pays tribute to the men and women who have served and continue to serve in UN peacekeeping operations, for their high level of professionalism, dedication, and courage, and to honour the memory of those who have lost their lives in the cause of peace. The ceremony will be joined by representatives of government, the armed services and police, and members of the diplomatic community. The Band of the Royal Marines will provide musical support. All are welcome to attend.

On 12 July, 18:30, in Room1, House of Lords, UNA Westminster is hosting a public meeting on *Who cares about human rights* beyond the horizon?. The speaker will be David Hammond, Chief Executive, Human Rights at Sea.

This century saw a sharp rise in piracy in the Indian Ocean, leading to the capture for ransom of passing cargo ships. This revealed a shocking truth, well-established mechanisms for valuing and negotiating the release of a ship's hull and its cargo, but none for securing the safety of its crew, destined to remain hostage in appalling conditions, sometimes leading to their death. David Hammond will review progress towards international policy change and introduce the new *Geneva Declaration on Human Rights at Sea* which sets out to extend human rights engagement under existing international law.
