While we remove our masks and stop frequently washing our hands, many of us are having another COVID inoculation, reminding us that this disease is not fully defeated. In the UK it has become an occasionally annoying intrusion into normal life, but in parts of India, with low vaccine coverage, it is still rampant, with devastating effects on many people. Therefore we welcome the launch this week by the World Health Organisation of its new Preparedness and Resilience for Emerging Threats Initiative and hope that countries are better prepared for the next pandemic. Some UNA branches have ensured wider awareness of the issues involved.

We are half way through the term of the <u>UN's Sustainable Development Goals</u>, their "universal call to action to end poverty, protect the planet, and ensure that by 2030 all people enjoy peace and prosperity". Some UNA branches belong to local fora working in their communities to help deliver these goals both locally and internationally. Other branches use the 17 goals – no poverty, no hunger, good health and well-being, quality education, gender equality, clean water and sanitation, affordable and clean energy, decent work and economic growth, industry innovation and infrastructure, reduced inequalities, sustainable cities and communities, responsible consumption and production, climate action, life below water, life on land, peace justice and strong institutions, partnerships for the goals – as important subjects for their branch activities.

The current UK media focus is on the civil war in Sudan. Many UK nationals are fleeing from the fighting, while UN agencies are working out how to address the humanitarian needs on the ground. Some UNA branches are looking at the history of this situation, as well as at how the international community can help.

Human rights – sustainable development – peace and security: these are the 3 pillars of the United Nations on which we are trying to increase awareness and in which we must encourage more effective – and more generous – UK government engagement. All pillars are addressed in the events in this edition of Pulse.

The UN's slow response in response to the earthquake-induced suffering in the rebel-held areas of north-western Syria resulted in widespread unnecessary suffering and, sadly, is not unique. 
Environment
