From Our Chair

Thank you, UNA Canterbury, for hosting an energising LASER Summer Council, examining refugee issues, locally, nationally and internationally. We were delighted to meet some inspiring refugees as we learned about the remarkable range of support provided by local voluntary organisations, helping these traumatised people with their legal, practical and emotional challenges. Elizabeth Ruddick from UNHCR then reminded us of the global framework for such activities, based on the [1951 UN Convention on the Status of Refugees](#), updated in the [2018 UN Global Compact on Refugees](#), which recognised that

“sustainable solution to refugee situations cannot be achieved without international cooperation”. It was salutary to be reminded that more than three quarters of refugees are hosted in low and middle income countries, the vast majority of refugees staying in countries neighbouring their own.

The fact that France and Germany each receive more than twice the number of asylum seekers of the UK also contradicts the ‘UK invasion’ rhetoric being used by government ministers. Both the 2022 *UK Nationality and Borders Act* and the currently debated *Illegal Migration Bill* include several breaches of our commitments under International Law, such as criminalizing and penalizing or making stateless some asylum seekers. Those of us committed to the UN framework and to international cooperation must ensure that our government meets its obligations in supporting those seeking asylum here. We can [join campaigns](#) on these issues.



We were reminded, too, of the strong links between LASER's current issues of concern. In particular, climate change is often a driver of both displacement and of conflict, adding an urgency to meeting our commitments under the [UN Framework Convention on Climate Change](#) (see our campaign below). The continuing reduction of our overseas aid budget drastically endangers our meeting our obligations both for refugees and for climate change mitigation, as well as for providing humanitarian assistance and life improvements for the world's most disadvantaged people. The recent resignation of Lord Zac Goldsmith, whose ministerial portfolio included Energy, Climate Change and the Environment, reminded us that the government is slipping on its climate change commitments. [Briefed here](#) by our Campaigns Officer, Valeria Minisini, we must all urge [our MPs](#) to keep up the pressure to:

- phase out fossil fuels;
- protect global food systems;
- connect the climate and biodiversity crises;
- meet our commitments to recognise the needs of all people (particularly the world's poorest and most vulnerable) in the mitigation of climate change

UNA Enfield and Barnet

On **19th July**, and **25th July**, both at **19:00 – 20:30**, the Enfield Climate Action Forum is running two online workshops with Enfield and Barnet UNA (EBUNA) on **From Global to Local - Deploying En-ROADS to support local climate actions**. They will examine a climate model – **En-ROADS** (Energy-Rapid Overview with Decision – Support) and its potential deployment in supporting local climate action. The model was developed by Climate Interactive in collaboration with the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and is used worldwide. These workshops will be presented by **Ali Hessami**, an expert on risk assessment and a champion of the En-ROADS Model.

The first workshop, on 19th July, will introduce the climate model and its six principal parameter classes and explain its potential in building actions to help tackle climate change locally. For this first workshop, please register [here](#).

The second workshop, on 25th July, will follow up the introductory session, exploring the six principal parameter classes of the En-ROADS model for pragmatic local action and help identify policies, initiatives and citizen actions that can make a positive contribution
