2023 Updates



Updates On UNA LASER 2023 Campaigns This year, UNA London and Southeast Region (UNA LASER) has: campaigned on:

- the political turmoil in Peru
- human rights in the Holy Land
- changes in UK aid harming the world's most disadvantaged people
- climate change and COP28

As we pass the midpoint of 2023, and with the imminent meeting of the UN General Assembly, and then COP28 we reflect on our campaigns, noting developments and new priorities; where change is needed, we must keep up the pressure.

COP 28

Most urgent is to build up the momentum for COP 28, particularly as the government could be <u>backtracking on environmental issues</u>, and about to break its £11.6 billion climate finance promise to vulnerable countries. Keir Starmer, is indicating that the <u>Labour Party is also hesitating</u> in its support for climate finance. So do:

- join the Climate Coalition in emailing your MP
- sign Friends of the Earth's petition
- encourage any schools you know to get <u>Creative for Climate</u> <u>Justice</u>.



Support For Branches

Climate Information



UNA Climate and Oceans has launched a <u>Climate Action Platform</u>, with a wealth of information and down to earth climate action advice, at global and local level. The platform includes fully interactive maps and useful links with lots of great information and fantastic advice. This is Phase I; they will be adding more elements to the Platform in the coming weeks. Comparing countries could be particularly useful in the run-up to COP 28.

Note, too, the Energy Dashboard and the section on Food choices.

UN Special Rapporteurs as Speakers

The UN Human Rights Council has about 50 Special Rapporteurs, as well as fact-finding missions and working groups on different aspects of human rights. Part of their role is to raise awareness of their issue of concern and they are usually excellent communicators – and therefore good speakers for UNA events. Some of those based in the UK are: Nazli Ghanea from Oxford University on Freedom of Religion or Belief; Javaid Rehman on Iran, and Alexandra Xanthaki on Cultural Rights, both from Brunel University. Sardar Ali of Warwick University is a member of the fact-finding mission on Iran.
