From Our Chair

This autumn there are many reasons for special focus on the UN.

- The opening of the General Assembly was marked by the normal <u>High Level meetings</u> without, for the first time in a decade, the presence of the UK Head of Government
- September 26 was the 10th International Day for Total Elimination of Nuclear Weapons. LASER has endorsed the Protect the People and the Planet appeal
- Halfway through the process for the <u>Sustainable Development Goals</u>, only 15% of the goals' targets are on track. To summarise the situation and raise our ambition, Project Everyone has released <u>this film</u>, based on Al Pacino's epic locker room speech.
- We prepare for the crucial COP28 in Dubai (30 November 12 December) amid fears that the UK is planning to weaken our net zero
 policies. LASER has endorsed this letter to the government. Al Gore's latest TED talk summarises the situation well
- 10th December marks the 75th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. There are ideas for marking this <u>here</u>, where the 75 day countdown has begun and is being marked daily by stories, videos, fun facts.

At this time when the UN will be more in the news than ever, people will be searching online for how they can be involved. It is crucial for us to seize this opportunity to engage with new people. New resolutions should be of a maximum of 175 words. You can also suggest amendments to existing resolutions which should add not more than 75 words to the total length of the resolution. The draft agenda (with motions amalgamated as appropriate) will be circulated early in February to give you an opportunity to propose amendments.

William Say UN Internship



Following the death of lifelong UNA member William Say last year, his friends have been thinking of ways of honouring his memory. William had served as an intern at the UN both in New York and Geneva, roles that he funded through savings and by working in various part-time jobs. Unlike other countries, the UK offers no financial help to people seeking to get on what for many could be the first rung of the UN career ladder.

UNA Westminster and Harpenden branches, with which William was closely associated, are setting up a project group to establish William Say UN Internships to enable young people to participate in a UN internship who

would not otherwise be able to. The project group will be holding its first meeting shortly. Please contact Paul Mrazek for further information or if you wish to join the group.

As we pass the midpoint of 2023, and with the imminent meeting of the UN General Assembly, and then COP28 we reflect on our <u>campaigns</u>, noting developments and new priorities; where change is needed, we must keep up the pressure.
