From Our Chair

It was good to see many of you – in-person and online – at our Policy Conference on 9th March. A huge amount of work and expertise had gone in to drafting and amending the resolutions that were presented: congratulations to all the groups involved and many thanks to our Policy Committee. The agreed resolutions are now on our website. Do share these with your MPs, as well as with local candidates in the forthcoming election; they can be a useful framework for any hustings we organise.

As you will have seen, we covered a wide range of topics, particularly the current horrific Israel-Gaza conflict. It is encouraging that attempts are being made to avoid more suffering and war by using legal means, such as through the International Court of Justice. This legal pathway to resolve conflict is the aim of <u>LAW not War</u>, of which LASER is a member.

On 15th March, LAW not WAR is launching a crowdfunding campaign to which this film is an introduction. The final version of LAW not WAR's Zero Draft Pact for the Future will be adopted at this summer's UN Summit of the Future, the preparation for which you can keep up with by signing up through the Summit of the Future Information Clearing House.

LASER Dates

On 22nd June, 10:30-16:45, at St. Peter's Community Centre, Church Street, Bexhill-on-Sea, TN40 2HE UNA Bexhill and Hastings are hosting the LASER Summer Council on *Ploughshares into Swords*, considering ways to replace wars by sustainable peace as envisaged in the UN Charter. There will be speakers (including Professor Richard Sakwa), workshops and informal networking. The programme will build on UNA Bexhill and Hastings' 6-year project, developing a Peace Policy Statement, as well as the LAW not WAR campaign. Enrolment will be open from next month. Although the event will be hybrid, discussion will be an important component, so we encourage as many people as possible to attend in-person. On 2nd December at Bermondsey Village Hall, we shall hold our AGM and annual address by our President HE Dr Fatou Bensouda. We shall then be looking for a new President, for which role I would <u>welcome suggestions</u>.

Campaigning

Boycotts, Divestments and Sanctions

Boycotts, divestment and sanctions provide peaceful but powerful means for people to demonstrate their disapproval of the behaviour of some other organisation or country. These techniques were enormously effective in ending apartheid in South Africa. Many organisations now try to trade, invest and engage ethically, avoiding supporting illegal or immoral activities. The Economic Activity of Public Bodies (Overseas Matters) Bill would prevent any publicly funded organisation from putting pressure or avoiding trading with organisations of which they disapprove. (The Bill explicitly mentions organisations in Israel, Occupied Palestinian Territories, Occupied Golan Heights as not to receive boycotts, divestment or sanctions.)



We continue lobbying in LASER against this Bill. Please write to your MPs against it. Since the Bill is now awaiting its committee stage

in the House of Lords, due on 20th March, please write, too, to any peers you know – including the present and previous Chairs of UNA-UK, Baroness Joyce Anelay and Lord Stewart Wood — urging that this Bill should not be passed. **You've still – just! – got time to take action to prevent this proposed removal of a key way of our peacefully addressing immoral actions by organisations and governments.**

Climate Change
