From Our Chair

On 1st April it seems that Israel attacked the Iranian consulate in Damascus, breaking Article 22 of the 1961 Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations. This attack was a step change in the pattern of escalating Israeli attacks in Syria since the Hamas massacre of more than 1,000 Israelis on 7th October. Iran then made it clear that it would retaliate but waited nearly 2 weeks before launching its first-ever direct attack on Israel. This gave time to Israel and its allies (mainly the US, but also including the UK and France) to strengthen Israel's defences. They managed to destroy more than 90% of the 300+ missiles and drones that Iran fired on Israel, resulting in only a few civilian injuries (no fatalities) and some damage to a military facility. This attack demonstrated both that Iran would respond to direct attacks (such as on the consulate in Damascus), and the strength of Israel's defences. Surely honour can be satisfied on both sides. However, the welcome distraction for Israel of media attention away from the 33,000 deaths and continuing terrible suffering in Gaza - as well as Israel's angry statements in response to Iran's attacks suggest they are planning further to escalate the hostilities with Iran. We hope the urging of their allies – including the UK – as well as the demands of the UN Secretary-General - will convince them that "it is time to step back from the brink". As the Secretary-General stated, all should focus on our "shared responsibility to secure an immediate humanitarian ceasefire in Gaza, the immediate and unconditional release of all hostages, and the unimpeded delivery of humanitarian aid."

Campaigning

Palestine

The deaths and devastation in Gaza continue unabated. What can we do to try to help?

- We can co-sign <u>this letter</u> UNA-UK has signed to the UK Foreign Secretary and Trade Secretary, urging the cessation of UK arms sales to Israel.
- We can <u>write to our MPs</u> to resist the *Economic Activity of Public Bodies (Overseas Matters)* Bill which resumes its
 Committee Stage in the House of Lords on 17th April, and will then return to the House of Commons if you think bodies
 that receive public funding should be able to boycott a country or company of whose behaviour they disapprove (as they did,
 to great effect, in the campaign to end apartheid in South Africa and as many do now, for example, over goods made in
 illegal Jewish settlements in the Occupied Palestinian Territories).
- We can <u>crowdfund LAWnotWAR</u>, promoting the use of legal means such as the International Court of Justice and the International Criminal Court– to resolve conflicts.

Women, Peace and Security

Women and girls constitute more than 70% of the more than 33,000 war deaths in Gaza since October 7th and they are also suffering disproportionately (such as by women having caesarean births with no anaesthetic), As we approach, in 2025, the 25th anniversary of the ground-breaking <u>UN Security Council Resolution 1325</u>, and following the publication of the UK's fifth <u>National Action Plan on Women, Peace and Security 2023-2027</u>, our Campaigns Officer, Valeria Minisini, explains the key issues <u>here</u> and suggests we all write to our MPs and to the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office to urge the UK government to:

- promote more actively the participation and leadership of women in conflict-affected settings;
- encourage the consultation of women's and girls' organisations in conflict-affected regions;
- ensure the Ministry of Defence consults and integrates women and girls into peacekeeping processes;
- give more core, flexible and multi-year funding to feminist organisations;
- prioritise the ending of all conflicts, including by observing the <u>International Arms Trade Treaty</u> of which the UK is a signatory, and having an arms embargo on parties to conflict suspected of breaking international humanitarian law.
