From Our Chair

Two places continue to experience immense civilian suffering and deaths after months of conflict: Sudan and Gaza.

Key UN agencies trying to help are the World Food Programme (WFP) in Sudan and the UN Relief and Works Agency in Gaza. The UN's top aid official in Sudan, Clementine Nkweta-Salami, has said "People are resorting to eating grass and peanut shells" and are "trapped in an inferno of brutal violence". At least 165 members of UNWRA have been killed in the line of duty since 7th October. This work is dangerous and desperately underfunded as the <u>UN Secretary-General recently described for Sudan</u>.

We can all help fund the WFP work in Sudan and the work of UNWRA in Gaza

Campaigning

Using Financial Pressure to Protect Human Rights



Students around the world are pressurising their institutions to use their financial powers to protect basic human rights in Gaza. The *Economic Activity of Public Bodies (Overseas Matters)* Bill – which is scheduled to have its final day of committee stage in the House of Lords on **4**th **June** – would prevent bodies that receive public funding from boycotting or divesting from a country or company of whose behaviour they disapprove, as many do now, for example, over goods made in illegal Jewish settlements in the Occupied Palestinian Territories.

Do <u>write to your MPs</u> and to members of the House of Lords (such as former Chairs of UNA-UK, <u>Baroness Anelay of St Johns</u>, <u>Lord Wood of Anfield</u>, <u>Lord Hannay of Chiswick</u>) to resist this Bill, if you think bodies that receive public funding should be able to use their financial leverage to protect human rights (as they did, to great effect, in the campaign to end apartheid in South Africa).

Long-term peace in the Holy Land



While we continue to campaign for a ceasefire and for UN support for UNWRA, it is important also to consider how to reach a long-term solution. Returning to a situation like that on 6th October last year would continue to deny the rights of the Palestinian residents of Gaza and the West Bank and generate further violence.

The Balfour Project argues that we must change the imbalance of power between the State of Israel and the Palestinians by moving towards Palestinian independence. They say, "There can be no just solution without an independent Palestinian state in which the Palestinian people are free to live in security and shape their own future. No longer can the political will of powerful states continue to stifle the right to self-determination of the Palestinian people. Now that the US has vetoed the Palestinian request for recognition as a state at the UN, it is time for Britain to do what it should have done decades ago – recognise the State of Palestine." 
