Elections provide a unique opportunity to influence politicians of all parties when they are anxious to win the votes of their electorates. Both as individuals and in our groups, let's use this rare politicians' listening time to ensure our political candidates know that, for many of us, international policies are high on our agendas and important in our voting choices. Not only should we write to all our local candidates, but we can take part in local hustings — either our own or those organised by others. We can remind aspiring politicians that the UK deserves to remain one of only five permanent members of the UN Security Council only if it respects international rules and supports the rules-based international order, which it was a major actor in creating, 80 years ago.

<u>Here</u> are the detailed suggestions from our Campaigns Officer, Valeria Minisini. She suggests that, linking up with our earlier campaigns, we focus on:

- restoring UK overseas aid to 0.7% gross national income
- committing substantial support to the UN <u>Loss and Damage Fund</u>
- urgently phasing out fossil fuels
- stopping arms sales to Saudi Arabia
- signing the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons (<u>TNPW</u>)
- cancelling <u>Trident</u>
- actively pursuing peace in Israel/Palestine
- supporting the rules-based international order.

The Climate Coalition, of which LASER is a member, asks us to call all political parties to commit to cut emissions, restore nature and support the hardest hit at home and around the world. They have launched a <u>Climate Hub</u> to share a map of election hustings events around the UK and to see what's happening close to each of us.

SDG Forum and Annual Service for Peace

Threat to Democracy in India


UNA Streatham and Clapham
